El Sereno Middle and Wilson High Schools' Middle Years Program Middle Years Programme Admissions Policy

In LAUSD students are guaranteed enrollment at their Resident School or they can apply to a different program through the Zone of Choice and Magnet Programs. All 6-8 grade students enrolled at El Sereno Middle School and all 9 -10 grade students enrolled at Wilson High School are automatically Middle Years Program students and are not required to complete an application for admission. Students at Wilson High School that did not attend El Sereno Middle School still have the opportunity to access years 4 and 5 of the MYP curriculum.

The resident LAUSD School assignments linked below are in effect for this school year and are applicable to students currently eligible to enroll. School attendance boundaries are subject to change as warranted by shifts and growth in student population, by opening of new schools and the reopening of closed schools, and as deemed necessary by LAUSD. Information about schools with boundary changes effective in the upcoming school year and the areas affected by the changes is available on the <u>Boundary Change Information Page</u>.

Wilson and El Sereno are both in the NorthEast Zone of Choice. Zones of Choice are geographic areas which include multiple school options. These schools offer exciting programs in the arts, business, science, humanities, social justice and more right in your neighborhood. Any student residing in a Zone of Choice is eligible to apply by selecting and ranking the schools based on preference. Eligibility is based on home address and the school's enrollment capacity. If you live in a Zone of Choice area, please visit your neighborhood school to complete a Zones of Choice application or visit the <u>Zones of Choice</u> website to <u>download an application</u>. To determine if you live in a Zone of Choice area, enter your current address in the <u>Resident School Identifier</u>.

All MYP Students in grades 6-10 have access to MYP classes. Students in specialized programs such as ELD, USC/NAI, Magnet and AVID, sometimes take specialized classes that do not fall under any IB MYP Subject Group, but they are still MYP students and the majority of their classes are MYP.
