The Smarter Balance Assessments are in full swing at Wilson HS. We are proud of our 11th graders. In the first week of testing, 95% of 11th graders completed the California Science Test and the SBA ELA test. Reaching **95%** in the first week alone shows that our 11th graders are hearing the message about importance of school attendance during this important testing period.

This coming week, our 11th graders take on the SBA Math test. Let's continue to motivate our students to reach the goal of 30% of students scoring Met/Exceeds in Mathematics. You can do it!

BUILDING CAPACITY

EGL Certification

Our work on Equitable Grading and Instruction continues. Thank you to the work of the EGL Champions and certified teachers helping with each round of training, nearly half of our teachers have completed the training. According to Mr. Aragon, currently, we have 36 teachers that have completed the in-person EGL Certification training. Of those 36, 22 are EGL Certified. 14 more are looking to complete the asynchronous summative task before the end of the academic year to complete their certification. Additionally, 9 teachers have signed up for the 06/15 & 06/16 Summer EGL Training. If you are interested in signing up for the summer cohort, (June 15th and 16th) please sign up with Mr. Aragon.

EGL is a core component of instruction at Wilson HS. It will drive what we teach, how we teach, and how we will assess student performance.
